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
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We used to hop upon our bikes and go out for a ride. But now we barely do a thing, we mostly stay inside.

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Now I think I understand some things I did not see. It isn't Dad who's made the change, the change occurred in *me*!


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I'll have to try explaining thatI'm no longer a pup. I am acting differently because I'm growing up!
